



Genetics of Autism Research Opportunity with Emory University School of Medicine and the Marcus Autism Center

Purpose: We are trying to learn more about possible genetic causes of autism. Families that have one child (age 4-17) with a known Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) may be eligible to participate in a free-of-charge diagnostic and educational assessment.

Benefits: The child with an ASD will receive a no-cost developmental assessment with a team of psychologists, genetics specialists, educational specialists, and a developmental pediatrician. A research summary and treatment recommendations will be provided after participation.

Eligibility Criteria:

- One child (age 4-17) with a KNOWN diagnosis of an ASD
- Child with ASD does NOT have Downs Syndrome or Fragile X
- Both biological parents are available to participate
- At least one typically developing sibling (age 4 and above) is available to participate
- No other children in the family have an ASD

Location and Time: Research participation requires two appointments (approximately 1.5 business days) and takes place at the Emory Autism Center, Emory Human Genetics Clinic, or the Marcus Autism Center.
